#### A Letter from our New Interim Minister, Rev. Susan Murtha:

Dear New Friends at First Church of Christ Woodbridge,

First, thank you very much for your patience over the past months as I completed my interim ministry at the United Church of Christ, Southbury. I am delighted to be called as your Interim Minister in Woodbridge and I very much look forward to beginning our ministry on February  $1^{st}$  – learning about your personal and community faith journeys, and leading your congregation through a faithful and fruitful "all-church" process of discussion, discernment, and decision-making about your future. That's a mouthful, I know! So, what's first? ...

#### "Sessions with Susan"!

Please stay-tuned for updates about how to join one of these six small group sessions – at the church or via Zoom – in the month of February. This is our first step and we want *every member of FCCW* to participate in one these sessions! Note that I plan to create the schedule for these small group conversations before I arrive on February  $1^{st}$  (or shortly thereafter); so, keep your eyes out for the options coming your way.

Since we will get to work quickly, I thought a few words of introduction here may be helpful and of interest:

I am a Connecticut native, though I have lived and/or spent extended periods of time in a few other states and countries. My 36-year-old son, his wife and two children live in California and visit with family in Connecticut for extended stretches. Simon is an engineer working on the autonomous vehicle project (aka the self-driving car) and his wife, Sarah, works in the field of corporate environmental sustainability. And yes, their children, ages 6 and 3, are the light of life!

Backing up a bit ... Raised as a Roman Catholic, my personal search for spiritual and religious nurture began in my college years as an engineering student. (Yes, engineering is a multi-generational theme in my family!) Among the richest of my experiences were six years worshipping with the Quaker Friends in northeast Connecticut. It was in the prayerful silence of those Sunday gatherings that I first heard God's call to preach the Gospel, though it would take some years until I acted upon that call. In my late-twenties, I left my engineering career to be a stay-home mom and homemaker. Our family found a church home at First Church of Christ in Mansfield, and it was there that clergy leaders and church members encouraged me to pursue a vocation in ministry. My years as a part-time seminarian at Andover Newton Theological School (1997 graduate) were blessed and prepared me so well for church ministry. In 2011, my then Regional Minister encouraged me to take the trainings for intentional interim ministry; I did, and it became a second calling for me. For the past 10 years, I've been serving as an interim minister to churches in transition. It's an honor, a challenge, and a deep blessing to lead and guide congregations through seasons of significant change.

There's more, but that's enough for now! Fun fact: Epiphany is my favorite season in the church year. In this season between Christmas and Lent, we rejoice that God's light and truth and grace are shown forth to all the world. I look forward to meeting you and your world in mid-Epiphany!

I shall be telling this with a sigh Somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood, and I--I took the one less traveled by, And that has made all the difference.




With congregational approval of the 2022 budgets on January 30, we will contract with Mr. Edwin Catalan to paint the wood trims of the sanctuary.

# Sanctuary Restoration Update January 19, 2022

Close-out reports have been submitted to the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) and to the Community Foundation for Greater New Haven who each provided generous grants that supported "Phase One" of the sanctuary restoration. The state grant will take several weeks to process and will obligate the FCCW to a 15-year historic easement on the sanctuary.

Erin Fink (SHPO) and Mike Forino (Preservation, CT) made a site visit to the FCCW on January 12. They were very pleased with the quality of "Phase One" work. SHPO has approved the church using the John Canning Company to complete the "Phase Two" decorative work on the plaster walls, under balcony, and the apse/chancel. A SHPO 50/50 matching grant of up to \$200,000.00 will be available for application later this year. They have advised we consider inclusion of the repainting of the narthex and the three stairwells, work on the pews, and improved ADA accessibility to the application. SHPO does not allow funding for a new carpeting and/or pew cushions. When the current surge of Omicron Covid subsides, an after-church meeting will be called to discuss the scope of the Phase Two work and to decide how much more financial investment the congregation wish to make to complete the sanctuary restoration.








#### Welcoming Reception for Rev. Susan Murtha
