The November meeting of the Council was held in the Parish House on the seventh after the worship service. This time and place have seen the attendance of more guests who can observe and participate in the meeting. We will continue with this time until the return to daylight savings time.



Highlights of the Meeting:

- * Treasurer's Report: Year-to-date expenses are \$19,901 less than budgeted and doing well. Treasurer Kit Engstrom will be resigning as of the January Congregational Meeting. Nominating Committee will be seeking a nominee for this position.
- * The draft letter from Stewardship's Committee Chair, Scott Hunter, was reviewed with suggested additions. The letter was to be mailed after Scott's review.
- * Personnel Committee report dealt with what FCCW was going to be doing about the Christian Education program for children and adults. Covid restrictions are still a factor, however, there was much interest and discussion regarding this program and the need to plan for and restart it. Questions about the Stocking Project were raised. (Comment Note: The Moderator contacted Donna Taylor who had previously coordinated this program. She came in the following week, organized it and Stocking Bags are now available for pickup in the Parish House Meeting Hall.)
- * Search & Renewal reported that a letter had been mailed to introduce the new Interim Minister, the Reverend Susan Murtha, who will be assuming her duties as of February 1, 2022.
- * Christian Service has made five donations to nonprofit organizations. Their budget has been expended for the year. A request has come from Amy Lan to this Committee as to what we, at FCCW, are doing regarding Afghanistan refugees who are coming to Connecticut. There was an approved motion to form an Ad Hoc FCCW Committee to decide FCCW's role and participation with this matter.
- * The Boy Scouts continue to be very active and have added three new scouts to their membership. The Troop will assist with the upcoming FCCW Trimming Bee.
- * Building & Grounds reported that the Parish House ladies' room is to be repainted and repaired with new and improved fixtures and flooring. The restoration of the Meetinghouse Sanctuary is progressing with estimates being received for wall painting. Scaffolding will be removed in mid-December in time for Christmas services and decorating. The organ will also be available for playing.
- * The Monetization Committee is awaiting times to meet with town officials, regarding proposed planning efforts.
- * Deacons reported that the Trimming Bee will be held on Saturday, December 4, and questions regarding the project should be directed to them. They are also developing a call list of parishioners who might wish to be visited or called. The Poinsettias Program will also be held this year.

SANCTUARY UPDATE NOVEMBER 19, 2021

The decorative work on the ceiling and north wall continues 'on schedule' and Canning expects to have their work completed by the week of December 6. Soon after, the scaffolding will be removed from the sanctuary and the organ will be re-assembled and tuned. By mid-December you will be able to view the ceiling from your pew. In the meantime, photographs of the restored ceiling rosette and beautiful décor can be viewed at www.uccw.org.

The Sanctuary Fund Phase One target of \$150K has not yet been met and currently stands at \$139,287.45. The final 2021 payment to Canning is due November 30. If you have not donated and would like to do so, please bring/send your designated Sanctuary Fund gift to the church office.

Once the Phase One completion report, photos and paid invoices are submitted to the State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO), they will send the FCCW the \$100K grant payment and they will permit an application for Phase Two of the decorative work to be made. Phase Two will complete the sanctuary decorative repainting project.

FIRST: THE WOODBRIDGE RESIDENT ASSISTANT FUND

This fund is an updated version of the former Food and Fuel Fund. The fund may now be used for food and fuel but also to assist residents in need with miscellaneous services that are necessary but not typically funded by outside agencies.

BOY SCOUT TROOP #907 NOVEMBER 2021 UPDATE




Troop 907 has grown by several scouts, and has been very active this fall. This December, the troop is planning a "Winter Freezeout Campout" December 10-12.
