A Letter from Church Council

The April meeting of the FCCW Church Council was the first in-person meeting in the Parish Hall in over one year. Two members were in attendance by ZOOM. A quorum was present.

The Treasurer's report showed that income continues to exceed expenses due in part to lower staff salary expenses, income from the Endowment Fund and a New Haven Foundation Grant.

Personnel reported that a new Office Administrator will be employed and in place by the end of April. The office will again be open five days a week, 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Details are reported elsewhere in this Parishioner. We thanked the Personnel Committee and Nancy Dickgiesser for her time and effort in the recruitment process.

The Search and Renewal Committee continues to meet on a weekly basis and have completed internal reviews of potential candidates for the Interim Minister position. This Committee has done an excellent job in assuring that we have ministerial coverage each Sunday. They have been doing independent study as well as some work with CT UCC. They are also working on reporting their progress directly to the congregation through the Parishioner and possibly email correspondence.

The segue to the Music Committee Easter Sunday Service was a report that this service received rave reviews and accolades from the over 60 persons in attendance, forty-two in-person and eighteen Zoom links. Many thanks to the Committee for its planning and to Connie, Al, Roger, Faye, Nenad, and Inkyung, the guest violinist, for a job very well done. It was great to be back, in person, at a Sunday morning service.

Christian Service reported that they have contributed to five local organizations. The Deacon's reported that The Rev. Anya Powers will in the near future be concluding her ZOOM Sunday services. Her leading of these services has provided spiritual inspiration and support for us during this time of transition. Our warmest regards and thanks go out to her.

Trustees have continued to monitor the financial and program activities of the church. They have also been receiving regular reports from the consultant, Anna Dickerson, regarding the reorganization of the office and its operations.

Guest, Joyce Simpson, provided a detailed overview of building and grounds activities. Most time was devoted to an update on the Sanctuary restoration and repainting. Due to her efforts, FCCW has received notification from the State Historic Preservation Office of \$100,000.00 in matching funds, which has been approved with guidelines and timetables to be followed. This means that we, at FCCW, will have to successfully raise monies for the project. Details for this effort will be forthcoming. We at FCCW owe a great debt of gratitude to Joyce for her time and devotion to, and extraordinary efforts for, FCCW. (cont.)

The Boy Scout report dealt with their spring fundraiser for the sale of fertilizer and plants. The troop continues to grow in numbers and holds meetings in the Parish House.

A new program effort, to deal with the technical life of the church, was reported on by Nancy Dickgiesser. This matter will be dealt with by a Council-approved Technical Advisory Committee, to serve as a sub-committee to Council. They will review all technical projects, programs and plans to include the website, equipment, and anything to do with the updating of the technical component life of the church.

The Moderator requested that all boards and committees be sure to notify and clear any meeting times in the Meeting House and Parish House with the church office. The monthly meeting calendar will be kept in the office.

The Moderator received Council approval to conduct the FCCW Annual Meeting on Sunday May 16th, at the conclusion of the church service and/or at 11 a.m. Notices will be forthcoming. While there are a variety of reports which will be presented at this meeting, one of the most important, especially this year, is the Nominating Committee's report which recommends officers and members of Boards and Committees for election. Without being overly dramatic, this may be one of the most important elections in the life of FCCW! The rationale therefore is thus: As we begin to look for and recruit an Interim and then permanent Pastor, it would certainly be a good selling point, on our behalf, if FCCW had a full complement of lay board and committee members, who are standing ready to work with this person, as FCCW continues its long history of serving and meeting the many needs, spiritual and civic, of this community.

On behalf of our church, I respectfully ask that you step forward and serve on a Board or Committee, even if for only one year, while we go through this period of transition. This should only require that you give, on average, two to four hours a month, depending on the board/committee. Your participation will go a long way toward insuring that the various lives of our church's programs and activities successfully continue. We, as members and friends of FCCW, should have an obligation to ensure that FCCW's long and meaningful history in this town continues as we move to our future. Please contact the Nominating Committee chairperson, Janice Touloukian, and volunteer to serve. Thank you for giving this matter some serious thought.

SANCTUARY UPDATE, APRIL 23, 2021

On March 25, the Board of Trustees voted unanimously to accept the \$100,000 matching funds from the State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO) for Phase One of the work.

David Riccio, the fine decorative arts expert and VP at Canning Company, Cheshire, Connecticut, visited with a small group of interested persons in the sanctuary on April 22nd to discuss the logistics and details of the proposed restoration work in preparation for finalizing a contract.

A Sanctuary Committee has been formed to send out letters to parishioners and friends in the wider community requesting donations to the Sanctuary Fund. One-third of the \$150,000 needed has already been received – THANK YOU SO MUCH. Raising the remaining \$100,000 will be vital to contracting with Canning to do the work sometime later this year.

Your generous donation would be most appreciated.

An Addendum to Constance Ecklund's Easter Sermonette 4 April 2021 First Church of Christ - Woodbridge, CT

Driving to Easter service where I was to deliver the sermonette on "Rolling Back the Stone," I saw the very handsome, very large racoon which had been lying dead on Route 114 since being hit two days before. Its clean body seemed still intact except for one area where it had felt the fatal blow. My calls to the police had yielded nothing. So, imbued with my emotional visit to God in the sanctuary, I stopped on the way home, pulled over, took a large towel out of my car trunk, and with hopes God would protect against any possible rabies, I drove the poor creature back to my street. There I saw the unexpected Henry Gates, in his freshly pressed chinos, who, also coming from our service, was now picking up trash from the road—one of his frequent good Samaritan acts of kindness. He agreed at once to come to my home and help. We took out all the heavy digging tools I had, and Henry set to work. The glacial moraine of Woodbridge made boulders and heavy stones a terrible burden. Yet, Henry, kneeling in the dirt in his best white trousers, dug and rolled back the stones. I said, without thinking—"we must now cover him"—and cutting up my church Easter lily and some tulips and violets placed them over the long body. Henry took on the heavy lift again, I said a prayer, and we had a final site for our beautiful furry friend. In my sermonette I had said how the great stone of Christ's grave is everywhere, and that we must work to recognize it in that Everywhere, removing it to bring goodness where we can. As I said thank you to Henry, he did not see me cry, but the realization that we had, indeed, reprised that Mark passage was, and remains for me still, unforgettable. I had in the sanctuary told Al Jarvis and now told Henry that, when my husband John had been buried, it was Easter-tide. In my grief, and not wanting to be alone that Sunday, I had asked my gardener to come with me. When we arrived with the church flowers we discovered that the gravesite was opened, the stones and dirt having been washed away by a heavy storm the night before. My friend did not speak English well, but he knew that the tears in my eyes were real. Now, I had met the Easter story as told by Mark and by John, and on the very day our sanctuary had reopened for us all to be given grace.


