One of the most frequently asked questions I have been asked since becoming Moderator is: "How can we get better attendance at Sunday morning services?" And I really do not have an answer. Yes, the Covid pandemic caused us to stop in person services and go to streaming and zoom and we seemed to become comfortable with that approach. We still only have an average of 20-25 "attendees" each Sunday. Before the pandemic we probably only averaged 30-40 persons in attendance on Sunday mornings. So, what is the answer, or better yet, what questions are we not asking? Recently, on the radio, I heard a minister



reference a survey question: "Why do people attend a church service for the first time?" The answer surprisingly showed that 15% had a variety of responses, 6% attended because of the church's minister, and 79% attended because they were personally invited by a member of the church! How accurate or valid is this information? I cannot vouch for the responses or even reference the survey. However, it got me to thinking------"Why don't we do that?" "Why aren't we inviting people to church?"

FCCW is now "OPEN". The office is open, meetings are open, Sunday services are open. Coffee hour is back. The choir will soon be back. We have had a good minister with a good message every Sunday. The Deacons and the Search and Renewal Committee(S&R) have arranged to have a minister in the pulpit every Sunday into the Fall. S&R has conducted Interim Minister interviews, reviewed many resumes, and has consulted with the Connecticut UCC. They are doing their job! It is now up to us, as individual members, to do our part----namely attend Sunday morning worship services in person!

There was, if my memory serves me, an old saying about "Voting and showing support for an issue by using your feet". In that vein, I am asking each and every one of the active members of our 150 members who are presently on the membership rolls to take three actions as we begin in September to start our new church year.



First: Attend at least two Sunday services every month, in person---walk in the front door of the church!

Second: Call a member of the church who has dropped out and not attended a service in a long time. Invite them to come with you or just "come and join us."

And **thirdly**: Invite a nonmember of the church to join you in attending a Sunday morning worship service. Use your feet to attend a service, use your feet to go to the phone and call someone and invite them to church. *(cont.)*



(cont.) Is this asking too much? Is it too simplistic? Can we do it? Do you have any other ideas? I will address this matter at the next meeting of Council on August 2nd.

Give me and other members of the Council your feedback. Call the office and share your ideas with Lisa, who can relay them to me. My friends, we must do something to get warm bodies into the pews on Sunday mornings! What good will a redecorated Sanctuary be if there is no one to see it? What do we say to a prospective minister when asked by them "How is your Sunday morning attendance?" I have an attendance goal in mind. When I see you in church, I will share it with you.

SANCTUARY UPDATE, JULY 2021

On June 30th, an agreement with decorative arts company, John Canning of Cheshire, CT, for Phase One of the sanctuary repair and repainting, was signed by the Chairman of Trustees, Roger Calistro. In addition, a fully executed agreement from the State Historic Preservation Office, to provide \$100K in support for the project, was received in June.

Scaffolding will be erected in the sanctuary the week of August 23. The Phase One work (ceiling, cornices, upper north wall, and re-installation of the plaster medallion above the chandelier) will begin in September and should be completed by early December. The sanctuary can remain open and in use during this period.

Fundraising is going well. Donations have been boosted by two very generous 50/50 'matching' challenges that doubled \$35K in contributions to \$70K. Memorial gifts, for Audrey Grey, Clement and Clare Clarke, Richard L. Wanner, and Ginny Calistro, were significant and often came with heart-touching tributes to how much the FCCW had meant to those remembered.

Phase One costs are estimated at \$250K. The Sanctuary Fund currently stands at \$125K. SHPO funding is paid after the work is completed. A huge "thank you" to all at FCCW and in the wider community who have donated so generously. We encourage anyone else who would like to support the restoration of this beloved, historic, Woodbridge landmark, to donate to the FCCW "Sanctuary Fund". Thank You,


UPDATE FROM THE SEARCH AND RENEWAL COMMITTEE UPDATE

In Memory of a Treasured Parishioner

On June 14, 2021, friends and family gathered at the First Church of Christ in Woodbridge to celebrate the life of a beloved longtime parishioner, Virginia Butler Calistro. This beautiful portrait of Ginny, courtesy of Kathleen Foster, accompanies her obituary below.



Virginia Butler Calistro

Virginia Butler Calistro, 96, passed away peacefully at home in Woodbridge June 9, 2021, leaving behind a large and loving family and a legion of friends and admirers. Virginia was born January 8, 1925, in New Haven. She was the daughter of the late Jessie McDaniel and James Bruce Butler of West Haven, and, along with her sister, the late Jessie Butler Throm and her brother, the late James Butler, attended West Haven public schools, graduating as valedictorian of West Haven High School in 1943. Virginia attended the University of Connecticut, where she lettered in women's basketball and, more importantly, met her late husband, Joseph Roger Calistro, a dashing airman newly returned from England. Virginia graduated summa cum laude in 1947, and immediately threw herself into what was to become an exceptionally long and successful career in education. Virginia and Joe were married in West Haven in 1949, and they spent most of their 65 years together as residents of Woodbridge, which they grew to love dearly. Along with "Papa Joe," Virginia raised and is survived by three children:

Virginia "Debbie" Culligan (Patrick) of Woodbridge, Roger Calistro (Kathleen Foster) of Meriden, and Cara Calistro (Ollen

Dupree) of Bowie, MD, as well as eight grandchildren: Rachel Acevedo (Victor), JP Culligan (Andi Crist), Daniel Culligan, Dominic Calistro (Emily), Virginia Calistro, Casey Culligan, Mya Dupree, and Elijah Dupree, four great grandchildren, and many beloved Butler and Calistro nieces and nephews. At the end of her life, Miss Ginny received special care and attention from Murley Barnaby and Nancy Sanca, both of whom became very dear to her and to the family.

Early in her teaching career Virginia became known as "Miss Ginny" to one and all. In the early sixties she ran a precursor to Head Start, a Neighborhood Improvement Project in Fair Haven. Recognizing her true calling as a preschool teacher Virginia then went on to establish Cabbage Hill Country School in 1963, a uniquely charming place that she operated for 46 years in the little red schoolhouse located behind her home. Cabbage Hill became the great passion of Miss Ginny's life, and through it she imbued generations of children with a love of learning.

"Miss Ginny" was a true extrovert, and in her inimitable and stylish way, was thoroughly involved in all of life around her. She was a devoted communicant of the First Church of Christ Woodbridge, where she served as a deacon, sang in the choir, and chaired many committees. She was active in the League of Women Voters for many years and supported her husband's distinguished career in local government. She was chair of the Woodbridge Library Commission and served on the Mental Health Board. Having successfully lost weight as an early adherent to the Weight Watchers program, Miss Ginny went on to become a popular Weight Watchers lecturer.

One of her great joys was marrying couples as "Judge Ginny", a Justice of the Peace. At the age of 85, she began participating in a Yale gerontological research program. In conjunction with Joe's career in international engineering project management, the couple travelled extensively, particularly in Africa. Of course, the effervescent Miss Ginny was a sports fan, cheering for the Yankees and the UConn Huskies, and never missed a party or an event. In 2019 the Town of Woodbridge named Miss Ginny one of its Living Treasures. Right up until the outbreak of Covid, Miss Ginny was an engaged participant in activities at the Woodbridge Senior Center and the Clelian Center in Hamden.
