In this photo, I'm smiling upon a young girl as I give her a Bible – one with her name inscribed inside the jacket. In the background, a young boy holds his new Bible by his side, and another reads a passage in his. On the table there are two stacks of Bibles. A woman from the congregation has prepared each one for a child, and stands ready to pass them to me, one by one, until all the children have their own Bible. Scripture tells us that every generation is called to pass on the biblical stories and message to the next generation ... Take care and watch yourselves closely, so as neither to forget the things that your eyes have seen nor to let them slip from your mind all the days of your life; make them known to your children and your children's children – Deuteronomy 4:9. And in our Protestant tradition, at every baptism, the congregation vows to actively participate, along with parents, in the growth of the child's faith. Together, these bring us to a particularly blessed occasion – that of giving children their own Bible! We do this ceremony in a worship service because it is a communal act; while the minister presides, it is the congregation that passes on the Gospel to the children in its flock, with their parents as witnesses.

In worship on April 28th, FCCW will live out its biblical calling and its congregational commitment to children's faith formation as we give Bibles to the children in our flock. Our hope is that as the children read these stories, they will become part of the story of people who sought to know God and follow in God's ways. After the children receive their Bibles (with personalized nameplates!), I hope to share a story for all-ages about the life of John Newton who wrote the famous and beloved hymn "Amazing Grace!" That is, after all, the Gospel message! After worship, we'll all join in the Parish Hall for fellowship and a Bible cake! #### FCCW CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT

The FCCW Church Council met by ZOOM on March 4, 2023 with a quorum present. The meeting and reports therein, reflect a continuing harmonious and positive progress of FCCW's activities and planning for future endeavors. Highlights of the meeting are as follows:

- Income for January has exceeded expenses
- A Concert is planned for mid March (Update: The Concert was reported as highly successful and well attended)
- The employment of a full time, permanent office administrator is still in process.
- The following recommendations of the Nominating Committee were approved by Council: Christian Corvino and Lou DeLeone as members of Deacons; Walter Crosby as a member of Nominating Committee
- Trustees continue to plan and gather information regarding the refurbishing of the Parish House
- By laws changes regarding elimination of the September Congregational Meeting will be presented for approval at the May, 2024 Congregational Meeting
- The final Stewardship results for the 2024 year show a 7% increase in pledges
- There was discussion regarding the need for revitalizing the Labyrinth, Gardens, and sprinkler system on the side and front of the Meeting House. This will be reviewed and reported back to the Council.

All-in-all, FCCW is enjoying a period of planning and introspection for and of its' present and future programs, activities and outreach as it begins to grow into its' future. Our Council meetings reflect these facts by positive reports and discussion as we review these present and planned programs. It forebodes, your Moderator thinks, of the best of times to come.

Scouts and adult leaders will assist at the Strawberry festival June 7th, campout at the church and have their spring Court of Honor on June 8th, all are invited. The troop also accepted a request from the Woodbridge Conservation Commission to adopt and become stewards of the Woodbridge Fitzgerald Track Trails, mostly behind the Woodbridge

firehouse. This includes hiking the trails, performing simple maintenance and advising the Woodbridge Trail Master of any issues. For this activity, scouts will receive Community Service hours.

The troop meets on Thursday evenings at 7:00 PM in the Parish House. Several new scouts recently joined the troop, any potential scouts and adults are always welcomed. More at troop907.org.




