Three Crowns: an Easter faith-story for children of all ages

Yes, it had occurred to me that there may be children with us in worship on Easter Sunday, but as I had not seen any since my arrival at First Church Woodbridge on February 1st, I decided to set aside that hope and stick to preparing an adult Easter worship service. And then in they came on Easter morning. Two children, and then two more, and then another two. Though I couldn't pull together an excellent one, God's Holy Spirit beckoned me ... tell the children the faith story! Here's the story I shared with children (of all ages) ...

People love kings and queens and princes and princesses. That was true in Jesus' day too. People noticed that Jesus was very special and very powerful and that he was a very good man. And they thought, 'Hooray, Jesus will be our king; God has sent us a king who will punish the bad people and reward the good people. And he will have an army of soldiers and win more land for us. And we will put upon our king a crown of jewels.' But Jesus told them, 'I am not a king like that.' He said, 'God has sent me to love and forgive all people.' Well, the more he said that sort of thing, the more sad and angry people got. And they forgot all about the crown of jewels and put a crown thorns on his head and put him to death on a cross and then placed his body in a tomb.

God was very sad. God climbed into the tomb and put aside the crown of jewels and then took off the crown of thorns and God gave Jesus life again and also gave him the crown of glory.

Lots of people who look at Jesus cannot see this crown of glory, but for all those who believe in him they see it. If you would like to see it, let me give you a hint: it's not on his head; it's under his feet. All those follow in his steps, they see it there and as they walk with him, they share in his crown of glory. And that is so much more wonderful than being a prince or a princess, a queen or a king. And that is my Easter wish for you – that you follow Jesus and share in his crown of glory.

There was a great intro that I couldn't recall in the moment, and great props I didn't have on hand, and a sweet "echo prayer" that I forgot to end with it. But the most important thing happened this Easter ... from Deuteronomy 4:8-10: "Take care and watch yourselves closely, so as neither to forget the things that your eyes have seen nor to let them slip from your mind all the days of your life; make them known to your children and your children's children."

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT -- APRIL 2022

The FCCW Church Council met with a quorum present on April 4, 2022, in the Board Room of the Parish House. After giving the opening prayer, Rev Murtha presented her report regarding her month's activities including the Sunday Retreat sessions, administrative duties, and suggestions regarding the earlier starting of Sunday worship ZOOM availability.

The Treasurer's report noted that February expenses were below budget, while total operating expenses for the year exceeded income, due in part to building heating costs. Overall, the financial status remains stable and cash balance is within the planned range.

Deacon's reported that plans, in cooperation with Rev. Murtha were made for Holy Week activities. Deacons have, after researching the membership list, developed a "call list" of thirty shut-ins and have begun coordinating visitations and calls thereto. The Technical Committee is purchasing new audio equipment, such as microphones, and a mini-PC. Jesse was thanked for all of his work in coordinating and improving our ZOOM and audio presentations.

A May 14 concert in the sanctuary was reported on by the Music Committee. Nenad will perform and coordinate the concert to include guest performers. The concert is open to members and the community with a free will offering for the benefit of a Ukrainian relief charity. A reception will follow. A written report from Christian Service was presented to Council.

Stewardship reported that all pledges are up to date. Future fund-raising plans will depend on the path FCCW will be taking. Plans are being made to review the overall fund-raising effort to include all components and aspects thereof.

In preparation for the Congregational Meeting in May, the Nominating Committee is reviewing FCCW Board and Committee (B&C) needs and will be contacting members for serving. Thought is being given to asking members of some (B&C's) if they'd be interested in moving to other (B&C's). Please consider serving. Your help is needed! The Personnel Committee is looking for volunteers for operating ZOOM Sunday services and other meetings. Lisa has successfully transitioned to all her new tasks and responsibilities including website and Facebook duties.


The Bylaws ad hoc committee reported on the final revision to the FCCW bylaws. After discussion, the revision was approved by Council for submission to the September Congregational Meeting, for discussion and approval. Bill More was thanked for all of his work on this project.

The Boy Scout report noted that the Troop will be holding its annual garden sale in April. Five scouts have participated in the Order of The Arrow ceremony. The Troop will coordinate the hot dog and hamburger cooking at the FCCW June Strawberry festival. We at FCCW continue to have many reasons to be proud of our relationship with this exemplary troop and its leaders.

The return of FCCW's June Strawberry Festival was presented and discussed. While there is presently a small group coordinating this festival, there will be a need for many volunteers to ensure its success.

The Moderator reported that he had sent a letter to the First Selectman of Woodbridge regarding the town's plans for a sidewalk along FCCW's property on Newton Road. This matter will continue to be followed, hopefully with FCCW participation. The May Congregational Meeting will be held on May 22, 2022, after the worship service. Plans now call for it to be somewhat abbreviated to coordinate with Rev. Murtha's Sunday Retreat program. Look for details, soon.

Lastly: If you have not yet attended and participated in our Sunday Retreat program, please know that you are really missing an informative, enlightened opportunity to participate in the future growth and direction of our beloved "Church on The Green". New times are coming. Join in!
