#### ~ Good News about our Children & Family Ministry ~

Our Kids' Church is overflowing with good things: approximately 25 children, bible messages in stories & artwork, mission / service projects, birthday celebrations, and more! FCCW's outreach ministry to families in the wider community is also overflowing with good things: we are always meeting new people, growing relationships, and nurturing family life!

Amid these joys, what's been lacking is sufficient paid staff to lead and support these programs. I write to share very good news ... we now have two staff members to lead and support our children & family ministry! ....

**Nicole Giannetta**, who has been with us since October and brought wonderful mission / service projects to our Kids' Church, working an average of 6 hours/week;

**Rebecca (Becca) Costa** (mom of Cadence, Elliot & Daisy), who will serve as Coordinator of Children & Family Ministry, working an average of 12 hours/week.

#### Dear parents of First Church Woodbridge,

I write this introduction letter to share a bit about my journey and my excitement about serving as the Coordinator of Children & Family Ministry at First Church of Christ Woodbridge, working alongside Ms. Nicole. I look forward to learning about your journey and to supporting your family at our growing church!

Two years ago, when our family began attending Sunday services at First Church of Christ Woodbridge, I was seeking a church community much like the one I grew up with in California. My primary focus: my children. I wanted my children to know God's love and to grow in faith in a welcoming church community.

Kids Church has made our transition to church life a hugely positive experience for my children. I say "transition to church life" because Covid's shelter-in-place and our relocation to Connecticut means FCCW has been my children's first real church experience. I am so very grateful they look forward to church every Sunday because of our Kids Church.

For the past 12 years, since welcoming my oldest son, Cade, I have been a stay-at-home mom. Cade was born Adrenal Insufficient, making daycare not an option, and we have happily made it work to keep me at home with Cade, especially as our family grew with Elliot and Daisy. I have loved spending so much the past 9 years at their schools in every capacity from Teacher's Aid, Room Mom, Chaperone, Book Fair helper, ... you name it, I've done it! Serving is not new to me; before welcoming my children, I was involved in Women's Fellowship at my church in California, regularly hosting events, leading fundraisers, and teaching in summer Vacation Bible School.

In the past couple years, I've shared with my husband that I am ready to go back to work, and that it had to be a position where I could still be there for Cade's needs, as well as for our other children. Recently, through serving on the Board of Deacons, I learned of the need to expand Kids Church and immediately felt compelled to reach out to see how I might help. In meetings with Pastor Susan, we have talked about the needs of our families. I am eager to work together, with parent and staff input, to serve the needs of Kids Church families and to lead our outreach family events throughout the year. An opportunity like this one is exactly what I have been waiting for.

I am very grateful and humbled for this chance to serve this church in another capacity, and I especially look forward to serving some of our youngest people (and maybe giving the moms and dads a little bit of a break, too)!

# FCCW CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT May 2025

Church Council met with a quorum present on April 7, 2025, in the Parish House Board Room. After an opening prayer, the minutes of the March meeting were reviewed and accepted. Rev. Murtha shared highlights of her church work in the prior month and going forward. A two-part Lenten program is planned, along with special worship services. A new staff person to serve as Coordinator of Children & Family Ministries has been hired. She is Rebecca Costa and will work with Nicole in the program. Parents of our Kids Church program attend a special session with staff to solicit their respective thoughts and input on the program. Comment: This whole program continues to be the shining gem for our church's future! She reported that eight new members will be joining our church at the May 4th service.

The Treasurer's report, prepared by our bookkeeper, Kim, was reviewed and approved. Trustees reported that Robert Sheiman has been hired to seek a new, mission-aligned tenant for the Parish House, looking at broad possibilities. Also, it is reported that FCCW will be financially secure for 2025 because of expected investment income, but that an anchor tenant is needed for the Parish House beyond this year. The Board of Music reported that Nenad is presenting a concert on Friday, May 2nd, in the evening. The Music Committee and Deacons are working together to bring special music to Sunday services during Holy Week, and monthly thereafter.

Other Committee and Board's reported routine activity for the month. It was not until the report from the Search Committee that the meeting took on an air of excitement. The committee reported that they had a unanimous agreement on a candidate for the Pastor position with whom a contract agreement has been reached. The candidate's experience closely matched all of our profile needs with significant experience in new initiatives and ministry to families of all ages. The candidate's name and experience are in a brochure and letter from the search committee and will be mailed to members and friends of FCCW. Plans are now being made for a "Candidating weekend" for May 17th and 18th, with a "meet & greet" reception on the 17th with the candidate and family, and preaching at the Sunday, May 18th service. After that service there will be a Special Meeting of the Congregation in the Sanctuary to hear from the Search Committee regarding their work and decision, and then a vote by members of the Congregation on a Call to the candidate. In order to implement this plan, a motion was made to change the date of the Annual Meeting to June 8th and to conduct the Special Meeting on May 18th. After discussion the motion was passed. Of note is the fact that Board and Committee reports will not be due until mid-May, but should still be reported on the period, May 1, 2024 to April 31, 2025.

The last item of business presented was that the Woodbridge Earth Day Committee has asked if FCCW will be participating this year in Earth Day activities, and if the Parish House can be used for performances in case of rain. Council agreed to the use of the Parish House if required as long as the Committee was responsible for following through, considering that use would probably be a last-minute decision. Sanctuary tours can be conducted if we can find volunteers to coordinate them. Pastor Murtha noted there were two members who had expressed interest in coordinating some activities at this Woodbridge event. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned after a closing prayer. The next meeting of Council is scheduled for May 5, 2025, in the Parish House.

Wicks** of Glastonbury to become our 51<sup>st</sup> pastor. We hope you've read the letter and brochure, introducing Rev. Wicks, sent in early April. You are most welcome to call the church office if you'd like these sent to you by mail or email.

Our next step in the process is "Candidating Weekend" on May 17 - 18.

 Saturday, May 17 (3:00 – 4:30 p.m.) We welcome you to meet and greet Rev. Wicks and his family at an informal reception in the Parish Hall.

#### Sunday, May 18:

- Worship Service: Please share in our worship service, in-person or via Zoom, where Rev. Wicks will offer the sermon.
- Special Congregational Meeting: Immediately after worship, we will convene a Special Congregational Meeting in the sanctuary where all members and friends of FCCW are welcome to ask questions about Rev. Wicks and the search process.
- Vote: Following this discussion, members of FCCW will vote on Rev. Wicks' candidacy to become our pastor. Members who cannot be present in-person will be able to vote via Zoom.

Look for the "Call to Meeting" printed in this newsletter and in Sunday worship bulletins.

The Search Committee is so pleased to have found Rev. Wicks and excited to introduce him to you. We are grateful for the confidence the congregation has placed in the committee and in our thorough process.

<u>Personal Hygiene Products</u>: Shampoo and Conditioner, <u>Unscented Soaps</u>, Deodorants, Kleenex, Shaving Supplies

They could also use some **specific food items**: Cooking Oils, Salad Dressings, Mayo, Coffee & Tea (both caffeinated and decaffeinated).

Make sure food items are not about to expire.










