FCCW CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT

The February meeting of the FCCW Church Council was held by ZOOM on the 5th of the month. This was, again, a rather routine meeting, making note of the fact that all functions of the church were progressing well and in a routine manner. All boards and committees were meeting and conducting business during this quiet time of the year. The Congregational Meeting in January had addressed important matters of concern and interest. Bits and pieces of information of interest: The new ZOOM cameras in the Meeting House have improved the quality of pictures being projected to viewers. There will be a Spring Concert with information to be forthcoming in the near future. Based on consensus of the Congregational Meeting, that the Church Council can act on conducting business after the 1st of the year; a function that had been decided at the September Congregational meeting, it was agreed that a bylaws change can be presented at the May Congregational Meeting addressing the elimination of the September meeting. The Pastoral Search Committee continues to have regular meetings to discuss the search process and will, when timely and appropriate, present information regarding their work. Trustees have been very busy and involved in matters falling under its jurisdiction. They continue to gather information and study financial facts and figures as they research the prospective offers of the various bidders on the cell tower leases. Information will be presented to the membership when it is timely and appropriate to do so. Regarding the bigger issues concerning the refurbishing the Parish House for use as an early childhood education center: Trustees is involved in researching the variety of approaches in doing this work in accord with the various regulatory agencies and contractors with whom they have to consult and plan, while also considering all the financial pros and cons involved in undertaking the needs, wants, and abilities of those concerned, to meet them. All this has to be undertaken while also giving attention to the respective needs of the church and prospective tenant. Our Trustees have a lot on their plate, and with the assistance and guidance of the Interim Pastor, Rev. Susan Murtha, and the consultant, Robert Sheiman, on the project, have given a great deal of time, effort, and energy to this project with the prospect of much more to be done. Reports, I know, on their achievements and progress will be forthcoming to the membership when appropriate and timely.

Didn't some great thinker from past ages say something like: "All good things come to those who wait!" I think we should, for the moment, adopt such a posture. There is much being done by delegated members of our church in meetings, phone calls and planning sessions. Give them some time. All that is being done promises to have great potential for a very bright and sound future for our Church On The Green. So, I ask, with all due respect: "Just Wait!"


Nenad Ivović has won competitions throughout Central Europe and Russia. We are very proud of our music director, who now shines in New York. Having received his Master of Musical Arts (MMA) at Yale, Nenad is now a student of renowned pianist Julian Martin at the Julliard School of Music and a private student of world-famous pianist Emanuel Ax. Nenad is working on his Doctorate of Music at the City University of New York (CUNY).

Ethan Brown is a cellist born and raised in New York City. Ethan has earned a Master's of Music from Rice University, a Bachelor's of Music from Northwestern University and is currently pursuing a DMA at the CUNY Graduate Center on a graduate fellowship. Through his graduate fellowship, Ethan began teaching as a part-time faculty member at Hunter College's Music Department in the Fall 2023 semester. Outside of teaching a small private studio of dedicated young cellists, Ethan performs frequently as a substitute for the orchestras of the Metropolitan Opera, Lyric Opera of Chicago, and the Houston Symphony. Ethan has previously served as principal cellist for notable performances at the Tanglewood Music Center, Spoleto Festival USA, Aspen Music Festival, and the university symphony orchestras of Northwestern and Rice.


Easter Flowers


