Dear First Church Members and Friends,

In the Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes, the author, Qoheleth, says "What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun."

# Thank you, Rev. Janice Touloukian

As we celebrate the arrival of our new settled pastor, Rev. Andrew Wicks, one final acknowledgement is in order: thank you to Rev. Janice Touloukian, who voluntarily provided pastoral care as a member of FCCW staff for many years. Janice counselled and visited people, led and co-led worship, offered communion, and prayed with and for us in difficult times. Janice has been a great source of comfort to many, and her willingness to volunteer her time and talent was a significant support during the interim ministry of Rev. Susan Murtha.

For those of you who do not know Janice she is a graduate of Skidmore College and Yale School of Divinity, with a special emphasis on clinical pastoral education. Among other postings she served as the Associate Pastor for Newtown Congregational Church for over twenty years. In 2012 Janice joined other Newtown clergy working on the front lines to comfort a bereft and shocked community following the horrific shooting at Sandy Hook School: parents, friends, children, and neighbors for whom God's grace and peace had vanished in an instant. That experience profoundly affected Janice, and after her retirement in 2015 she continued to offer care and support to grieving people. For her loving care and concern we are very grateful.

Although Janice is stepping down from the pastoral care staff, she will continue to offer prayers of guidance and consolation, to assist the Board of Deacons, and to be a valued and respected elder of First Church. Thank you, Rev. Janice Touloukian.



attendance and honor patrol. They participated in hikes, swimming, canoeing, wet sandwich relay team, craft challenges, friendship campfires, even encountered several bear visits, Scouts also earned merit badges and credit toward rank advancement which will be awarded at the troop's winter Court of Honor in December.


